Geordie Chapter HOG 1997-2007 TOM YOARS OM and OM and . . . BRIAN ROBINSON - CHAPTER HISTORIAN

Brian Robinson ingeniously took a different slant on the tenth anniversary of our very own Geordie Chapter HOG. One hundred years, a century of important events, within Harley-Davidson... read on! - Editor

1907: William A Davidson, brother to Arthur and Walter Davidson, joins the Motor Company. The first Harley Davidson was sold for police duty.

1917: During this year, roughly one-third of all Harley-Davidson motorcycles produced were sold to the US military.

1937: William A Davidson dies.

1947: Attendees at the year's 'Dealers' Convention' in Milwaukee are given a train ride to a "secret destination," which turns out to be the newly purchased plant on Capitol Drive.

The 74" OHV Big twin is introduced.

1957: The Sportster premiers.

1977 Harley-Davidson introduces the FXS Low Rider to the public.

1987 Harley-Davidson is listed on the New York Stock Exchange. Harley-Davidson begins the *"Buy Back Program,"* for the XLH 883 Sportster, which offers full trade-in value within two years on either a model FL, or FX.

1997 Harley-Davidson celebrates its 95th Anniversary. 140,000 plus riders are warmly received in Milwaukee, to help with the celebration.

Harley-Davidson buys a remaining 49% interest in the Buell Motorcycle Company. Erik Buell is named Chairman of Buell operations.

In that same year a small group of like minded folk, with a passion for motorcycling and a love of the Harley-Davidson brand, formed with the assistance of Just Harley's what would become known as the **GEORDIE CHAPTER HOG.**

As Dave Badcock recalls an entry made in his diary dated Wednesday 9th April 1997 that started the phenomenon we now know.

Dale Robinson, Davey Mac and Dave Badcock, sat in the Sun Inn, Morpeth, at 19:30 on that Wednesday, all those years ago and discussed a HOG Chapter to go with the new Harley-Dealership status that had been earned by Dale and Kelvin for the enterprise they christened just a few short years earlier as **Just Harleys**. This was located slap-bang in the middle between our *'local'* dealers, THE HARLEY SHOP, at Whitwood and ALVINS, in Edinburgh, a 120 mile trip to either. There were of course other non-franchised shops, A1 MOTORCYCLES on Westgate Road and AMERICAN HEARTBEAT in Darlington, but no social scene like we experience now.

So with the opening of **JUST HARLEYS** in Morpeth and their elevation to factory dealer status all the blocks were in place for the Chapter's formation.

Dale Robinson led the first 'organised' ride out one Wednesday evening from the shop in Morpeth. No one (not even Dale) knew where they were going and by all accounts he set off at a blistering pace, with a couple of visiting German bikers on his tail. The rest of the group, about 12, tried to stay in touch. Apparently Dale had raced Superbikes in the USA and he rode as if he'd been swept back in time and these two guys were not going to pass! In reality, they did not want to lose Dale! Several close calls later, after picking one bike from a hedge, everyone arrived at the pub where drinking and tales of 'daring do' were exchanged. The ride out's were interesting and not for the 'feint of heart' ... makes you realise the importance of a well-trained Road Crew!

JUST HARLEYS was now ensconced in the existing premises in Newcastle, Dale and Kelvins 'baby' had grown out of all recognition. Kelvin had been back in the mobile catering business and Dale held on, growing and developing the dealership into a model others would follow; but at a price. The men in suites, with their accountants meant Dale went to a Group of Dealerships down South, now known as Magic Group who run five Harley Dealerships and a BMW franchise. So Dave Badcock took over as Chapter Director and Chris Wearmouth as Assistant director.

Chapter monthly meetings were a mixture of stand up comedy and structured communication, ensuring all members got to *Ride safe and Have Fun*. The regular early year rides to Scotland kicked off the riding year and they built from 12 of us to over 100 participants that recently attended the ERRAGHAILTOURFORTHISSEASON'S kickoff event. It was bargain basement accommodation then, compared to the luxury we now go for, even the tour T-shirts were one colour print and now the fine designs we now see; how times have changed for the better, but still the same ethos: *Ride safe and Have Fun*. The one and only **HEART 'N' SOUL RALLY** had originally been established as a JH event, but it was to become our annual contribution to biking in the North East and grow into the premier *must do*' event it is now. The first year in Clennell Hall, with about sixty people, straw bales and a flat bed truck, as the stage, is a far cry from the slick operation we now enjoy at the Gosforth Park Racecourse. This growth and change of the rally directly reflects the growth and change within the Chapter. Rough and ready was an understatement for those early days, whereas slick and professional are today's bywords!

To run a club the size of Geordie HOG required dedicated individuals who were prepared to stand up and be counted, those stewards of the club should be applauded and praised because without them we'd have certainly floundered long ago.


It's a fact that we were the first UK Chapter to issue standards for Road Captains, which stands as a model today. All must have passed an Institute of Advanced Riders Course and been on an accredited first aid course. We were the first and I think still are the only Chapter offering a Road Marshal post to train up potential Road Captains. Yearly we encourage training. Many of our Road Crew have gained riding and first aid qualifications way above our minimum acceptable standard. We are the only crew to have had 'first bike on scene' training. We are all proud of our dedicated Road Crew and support them in all they do for the Chapter.

The Chapter is fantastic, It has grown and developed into a respected part of the Harley Empire. Many people have given much to the Chapter over the last 10 years and for sure the more you give the more you'll get out. So here is to the next ten years and those years after that; it's your Chapter and I am proud to be a member of it.





Norway Cruise & Viking Invasion 2003 By Dot Johnston



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








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Morpeth Fair Day & RVI Children's Ward Presentation





Brian Robinson ingeniously took a different slant on the tenth anniversary of our very own Geordie Chapter HOG. One hundred years, a century of important events, within Harley-Davidson read on! - Editor

1907: William A Davidson, brother to Arthur and Walter Davidson, joins the Motor Company. The first Harley Davidson was sold for police duty.

This was located slap-bang in the middle between our 'local' dealers, THE HARLEY SHOP, at Whitwood and ALVINS, in Edinburgh, a 120 mile trip to either. There were of course other non-franchised shops, A1 MOTORCYCLES on Westgate Road and AMERICAN HEARTBEAT in Darlington, but no social scene like we experience now.




